

Year 11 - Revision Questions - Pressures on the Physical Environment

1. Explain how cars or other vehicles may threaten the landscape in attractive areas such as National Parks. Use examples from an attractive natural landscape that you have studied (12 lines, 6 marks).
2. National Parks have attractive natural landscapes. Choose a National Park that you have studied and describe its natural attractions (7 lines, 3 marks).
3. A National Park is one organisation that is involved in protecting areas of attractive natural landscape in the UK. Name **two** other such organisations (2 lines, 2 marks).
4. For a National park you have studied, describe how local people might come into conflict with the need to conserve the natural environment (8 lines, 4 marks).
5. Places which attract many visitors are 'honeypots'. For a 'honeypot' you have studied describe its attractions and explain why it has become so popular (12 lines, 6 marks).
6. What is meant by:
 - Weathering
 - Erosion? (4 lines, 2 marks).
7. Explain how weathering and erosion have changed a landscape you have studied (8 lines, 4 marks).
8. For a natural landscape you have studied. Explain why people visit the area and the benefits for the local people (12 lines, 6 marks).
9. Why has the number of people visiting National Parks increased? (6 lines, 3 marks).
10. Describe how a 'spit' is formed. You may wish to draw a diagram (12 lines, 6 marks).
11. Choose a landform, that you have studied, that has been formed by erosion. Explain how it has been formed. You may use a diagram (15 lines, 6 marks).
